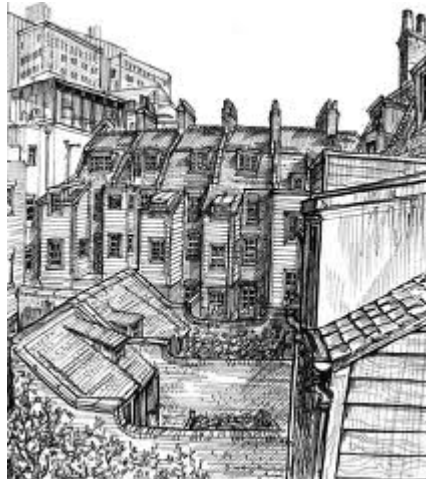


EAST END HISTORICAL WALK
